1. Financial Challenges Follow up

- a. We did not need to borrow any money. YAY GOD! Go Team!
- b. We are current with payroll as of 9/20/2016.
- c. We have \$40,500 in the Alaska USA checking account.
- d. We have been getting BHAP and ESG monies.
- e. Shelter food expenses went from \$1500 (July) to 0 in August, receiving food donations & food bank goods, and using what we had on hand. (Just don't mention 'hotdogs' to the kids)
- f. We have decreased our spending, including payroll in August and September.

We started putting 10% of every deposit (which we make on Fridays) into the AK USA savings account which has now grown \$500.00 to \$5,079. I would like to see the size of one full payroll, at a minimum in the savings, but of course we should have 3 months worth of operating costs at a minimum.

Long term sustainability:
