
Our Mission Statement

There are intrinsic benefits to having staff on-site. We all know that Fairbanks can deliver some hazardous weather conditions which makes travel difficult and sometimes dangerous. Having staff living on-site allows us to avoid schedule interruptions as a result of this. As an emergency shelter, the fewer things we have to worry about allows us to focus on quality care without disruption.

All of that to say—I have become a bit of a wanderer as we work towards a more sustainable model. I can be found at The Door most mornings, and at my new office in the afternoon. Growing pains—but good growing pains! Thank you for growing with us.


We still encounter kids who have never heard about The Door, and we continue to expand

After the Door?


We often receive questions about where kids go once they leave The Door. Tracking this information can be difficult, but we consider it very important. We will continue to refine this challenging data collection and recording process. Mediation services played a role in working through many family conflicts, and we worked consistently with other local agencies that provide long term housing as a 'next step' after The Door.
